

THE ASCENSION

"Jesus said to his disciples, 'You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth.' And when he had said these things, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight." (Acts 1:8-9) And then he was gone! They were . . . left behind! At least that's how the disciples felt. Two angels came and consoled them, though. They said, "This Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven." "Oh great," the disciples must have thought. Jesus really is gone for good then. He won't be back until the Last Day. The Gospel of Mark tells us that Jesus "was taken up into heaven and sat down at the right hand of God." (Mark 16:19) Normally, when someone sits down, it means he's done. He's finished <u>his</u> task. Jesus has finished his task of redeeming the world so now he tags the Holy Spirit who comes down to build the Church and finish the job. No more Jesus until the whistle sounds.

But Jesus promised his disciples, "Behold, I am with you always." (Matthew 28:20) And the Gospel of Mark says that after Jesus ascended into heaven, the disciples "went out and preached everywhere, while the Lord worked with them and confirmed the message by accompanying signs." So even though he wasn't walking beside the disciples like he did before his resurrection, Jesus was still with his disciples as they were his witnesses in Jerusalem, Judea, and Samaria and beyond. But Jesus is not only with the disciples; he's with us. Jesus said, "Behold, I am with you always to the end of the age." Long after the apostles were martyred, Jesus is still with us to the very end of the age. Jesus is still with us to make disciples of all nations, to the end of the earth.

But how is this possible? How can Jesus be with all of us around the world at the same time? Didn't he ascend into heaven and sit down at the right hand of the Father? Yes, but Jesus did this so he might fill all things. "[Christ] ascended higher than all the heavens, in order to fill the whole universe." (Ephesians 4:10) Seated at the right hand of the Father is not a physical location, but it denotes a position of power. "[God] seated [Christ] at his right hand in the heavenly realms, far above all rule and authority, power and dominion . . . And God placed all things under his feet and appointed him to be head over everything for the church, which is his body, the fullness of him who fills everything in every way." (Ephesians 1:20-23) Christ in his state of exaltation now has all power and authority from God to rule the world and rule his church. Christ no longer lays aside his divine powers like he did during his humiliation at the time of his earthly ministry. He now fully uses those divine powers for the benefit of his church. So now, Christ can be omnipresent in his body to fill all things. In a sense, Jesus left his disciples and ascended into heaven so that he could be with all of us.

On Sunday morning we don't board a plane to fly to Jerusalem to worship Jesus at the Temple. Nor is Jesus only at one church at a time each week like he used to travel from synagogue to synagogue in the days of the disciples. After his ascension, Christ is present wherever two or three are gathered in his name. He's present in our worship service in his Word and his Sacrament, but he's also present at the churches in Evansville, Indianapolis, and to the ends of the earth in Taiwan.

Since his ascension, Christ is present with us, but we also have the advantage that he is right next to his Father. When we pray in Jesus' name, Christ pleads and prays for us in the presence of his Father. It is because of Jesus that we sinners can pray to God and address him as "Our Father." "[Christ] is at the right hand of God and is also interceding for us." (Romans 8:34)

But Christ also ascended into heave to prepare a place for us there. "In my Father's house are many rooms; if it were not so, I would have told you. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back and take you to be with me that you also may be where I am." Christ is preparing a special place for you in heaven before he returns.

This is the comfort we have from Christ's ascension into heaven: his presence with us here and now, his presence for us before God our Father, a prepared place at the table for us in his kingdom, and a guarantee that he will return in the same way that the disciples saw him ascend into heaven.
