

Shown on the right is the painting of Jesus, as depicted knocking on the door in Revelation 3:20. The painting was dedicated in memory of Wayne Murl Metz (d.1940), two-year-old brother of Gloria Metz Arendt (confirmation class of 1950). The painting originally adorned the altar in the former red brick church (1881-1958). It appears in the background of several of the confirmation pictures in this book with the confirmands wearing their white robes, symbolizing Christ's righteousness bestowed at their baptism. After the existing church was built in 1959, the painting of Jesus resided in the choir room until it was relocated to the parish hall in 2019.



#### **Explanation of Luther's Seal**

The black cross in the center reminds us that Jesus died to take the punishment for our sins. The red heart reminds us of the love God has for us in sending Jesus to be our Savior. The red of the heart is the color of the blood of Christ, shed for us and for our salvation. The white rose helps us remember the work of the Holy Spirit who makes us pure and holy in God's sight by bringing us to faith in Jesus and by helping us to live our lives for Him. The sky blue background pictures the joy of the new life God gives to all who believe and trust in Him. Finally, the golden ring outlining the seal reminds us of our eternal inheritance - a home in heaven where we will enjoy complete joy and happiness in our Savior's presence.



#### Preface – What Does This Mean?

After Jesus suffered and died for the sins of the world and rose from the dead for our justification, He said to his disciples just before He ascended into heaven, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age." (Matthew 28:18-20)

What does this mean? With these departing words, Jesus gave His mission and marching orders to His Church. The disciples of Jesus began the work of His Great Commission by baptizing and teaching in His name, but after they departed in glory, Christ continued His mission as He raised up more disciples to spread the Gospel to all nations. The message of the Gospel crossed continents and seas until it found its way here to Trinity Lutheran Darmstadt in 1847. In this 175<sup>th</sup> anniversary year of our congregation, we remember and celebrate Christ's work of making disciples in our church through the baptizing and teaching of our youth in confirmation instruction.

Although Holy Baptism and the Rite of Confirmation are one-time events, these gifts of God have continuing effects in the life of the Christian. It is often said, "I was baptized," but the Christian sings "God's own child, I gladly say it: I am baptized into Christ." (LSB 594) While Holy Baptism occurred in his past, the Christian lives out the life of the baptized in his daily life. As Martin Luther says in our catechism, baptism "indicates that the Old Adam in us should by daily contrition and repentance be drowned and die with all sins and evil desires, and that a new man should daily emerge and arise to live before God in righteousness and purity forever." Likewise, when Jesus gave the Great Commission, He did not merely say, "teaching them all that I have commanded you," but "teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you." Teaching youth

all that Jesus commanded indeed occurs in confirmation instruction, but teaching youth *to observe* all that Jesus taught occurs daily in the home. Martin Luther prefaces the parts of the catechism with the words, "As the head of the family should teach them in a simple way to his household." As Christians, we continue to observe the teachings of Jesus by keeping the Ten Commandments every day. And, when we fail to keep the Law, we receive Christ's forgiveness through absolution and the Lord's Supper in weekly worship. Through these means the Holy Spirit keeps us with Jesus Christ in the one true faith until we die.

This book, entitled *This Is Most Certainly True*, is dedicated to the sainted Ray Steinkuhl (1928-2021) who was baptized at Trinity Evansville and confirmed, married, and buried at Trinity Darmstadt. In 2006, Ray gathered our youth confirmation pictures from the church archives, compiled them in two binders, and identified the names of the confirmands of each class. This book makes his work readily available to our congregation and also includes pictures of some of our members who were confirmed at other Lutheran churches. Ray is shown right as a youth in his confirmation class picture of 1941 and as a man whom God kept in the Christian faith throughout his life before entering his glory.





We should fear and love God so that we do not despise preaching and His Word, but hold it sacred and gladly hear and learn it.


#### The Fourth Commandment Honor your father and your mother.

What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not take our neighbor's money or possessions, or get them in any dishonest way, but help him to improve and protect his possessions and income.




#### The Tenth Commandment

What does God say about all these commandments? He says: "I, the Lord your God, am a jealous God, punishing the children for the sin of the fathers to the third and fourth generation of those who hate Me, but showing love to a thousand generations of those who love Me and keep My commandments." [Ex. 20:5–6] What does this mean? God threatens to punish all who break these commandments. Therefore, we should fear His wrath and not do anything against them. But He promises grace and every blessing to all who keep these commandments. Therefore, we should also love and trust in Him and gladly do what He commands.

#### HOLY BAPTISM SECOND

What benefits does Baptism give? It works forgiveness of sins, rescues from death and the devil, and gives eternal salvation to all who believe this, as the words and promises of God declare.

Which are these words and promises of God?

Christ our Lord says in the last chapter of Mark: "Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved, but whoever does not believe will be condemned." [Mark 16:16]

#### HOLY BAPTISM THIRD

How can water do such great things? Certainly not just water, but the word of God in and with the water does these things, along with the faith which trusts this word of God in the water. For without God's word the water is plain water and no Baptism. But with the word of God it is a Baptism, that is, a lifegiving water, rich in grace, and a washing of the new birth in the Holy Spirit, as St Paul says in Titus, chapter three:

### Confession



Who receives this sacrament worthily?
Fasting and bodily preparation are certainly fine outward training. But that person is truly worthy and well prepared who has faith in these words: "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins."
But anyone who does not believe these words or doubts them is unworthy and unprepared, for the words "for you" require all hearts to believe.

### **Morning Prayer**

In the morning when you get up, make the sign of the holy cross and say:

In the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Then, kneeling or standing, repeat the Creed and the Lord's Prayer. If you choose, you may also say this little prayer:

I thank You, my heavenly Father, through Jesus Christ, Your dear Son, that You have kept me this night from all harm and danger; and I pray that You would keep me this day also from sin and every evil, that all my doings and life may please You. For into Your hands I commend myself, my body and soul, and all things. Let Your holy angel be with me, that the evil foe may have no power over me. Amen. Then go joyfully to your work, singing a hymn, like that of the Ten Commandments, or whatever your devotion may suggest.



### **Evening Prayer**

In the evening when you go to bed, make the sign of the holy cross and say: In the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen. Then kneeling or standing, repeat the Creed and the Lord's Prayer. If you choose, you may also say this little prayer: I thank You, my heavenly Father, through Jesus Christ, Your dear Son, that You have graciously kept me this day; and I pray that You would forgive me all my sins where I have done wrong, and graciously keep me this night. For into Your hands I commend myself, my body and soul, and all things. Let Your holy angel be with me, that the evil foe may have no power over me. Amen. Then go to sleep at once and in good cheer.

1. Do you believe that you are a sinner?

Yes, I believe it. I am a sinner.

- **2. How do you know this?** From the Ten Commandments, which I have not kept.
- 3. Are you sorry for your sins? Yes, I am sorry that I have sinned against God.
- 4. What have you deserved from God because of your sins?

His wrath and displeasure, temporal death, and eternal damnation. See Rom. 6:21, 23.

- **5. Do you hope to be saved?** Yes, that is my hope.
- **6.** In whom then do you trust?

In my dear Lord Jesus Christ.

7. Who is Christ?

The Son of God, true God and man.


8. How many Gods are there?

Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night when He was betrayed, took bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to the disciples and said: "Take eat; this is My body, which is given for you. This do in remembrance of Me."

In the same way also He took the cup after supper, and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, saying: "Drink of it, all of you; this cup is the new testament in My blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."

# 13. Do you believe, then, that the true body and blood of Christ are in the Sacrament?

Yes, I believe it.

## 14. What convinces you to believe this?

The word of Christ: Take, eat, this is My body; drink of it, all of you, this is My blood.

# 15. What should we do when we eat His body and drink His blood, and in this way receive His pledge?

We should remember and proclaim His death and the shedding of His blood, as He taught us: This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me.

## 16. Why should we remember and proclaim His death?

First, so that we may learn to believe that no creature could make satisfaction for our sins. Only Christ, true God and man, could do that. Second, so we may learn to be horrified by our sins, and to regard them as very serious. Third, so we may find joy and comfort in Christ alone, and through faith in Him be saved.

17. What motivated Christ to die and make full payment for your sins? His great love for His Father and for me and other sinners, as it is written in John 14; Romans 5; Galatians 2; and Ephesians 5.

18. Finally, why do you wish to go to the Sacrament? That I may learn to believe that Christ, out of great love, died for my sin, and also learn from Him to love God and my neighbor.

19. What should admonish and encourage a Christian to receive the Sacrament frequently?

First, both the command and the promise of Christ the Lord. Second, his own pressing need, because of which the command, encouragement, and promise are given.





20. But what should you do if you are not aware of this need and have no hunger and thirst for the Sacrament?

To such a person no better advice can be given than this: first, he should touch his body to see if he still has flesh and blood. Then he should believe what the Scriptures say of it in Galatians 5 and Romans 7. Second, he should look around to see whether he is still in the world, and remember that there will be no lack of sin and trouble, as the Scriptures say in John 15–16 and in 1 John 2 and 5.


Third, he will certainly have the devil also around him, who with his lying and murdering day and night will let him have no peace, within or without, as the Scriptures picture him in John 8 and 16; 1 Peter 5; Ephesians 6; and 2 Timothy 2.





- R Yes, I do.

- R Yes, I renounce them.
- **P** Do you renounce all his ways?

- **P** Do you believe in God, the Father Almighty?
- R Yes, I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth.
- **P** Do you believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord?
- R Yes, I believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty. - P Do you intend to continue steadfast in this confession and Church and to suffer all, even death, rather than fall away from it?
- **R** *I* do, by the grace of God.
- P We rejoice with thankful hearts that you have been baptized and have received the teaching of the Lord. You have confessed the faith and been absolved of your sins. As you continue to hear the Lord's Word and receive His blessed Sacrament, He who has begun a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ.


