Evansville, IN https://www.momineestudios.com/ for the gift of the Trinity Lutheran Stained-Glass windows. These windows were extracted during the week of June 8 through June 11, 2022. They will be used in service on the campus of Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne, Indiana and the home of Worship Anew. Worship Anew (Formerly known as Worship for Shut-Ins), continues to broadcast nationwide on DirectTV Channel 377 (TCT Network 10:30 Central Time), world-wide on The American Forces Network TV, and on-line at www.WorshipAnew.org. These stainedglass windows will be restored to their original beauty and continue to reflect God's love of care and compassion. THE LUTHERAN CEMETERY, 1305 NORTH ST. JOSEPH AVENUE, EVANSVILLE, INDIANA, will hold a walking tour of the Cemetery on September 11, 2022, in honor of Benjamin Bosse who was buried here 100 years ago. The tour will be led by Vanderburgh County Historical Society member, Karin Kirsch. The program will begin at 1 p.m. with the dedication of a long-lost plaque that was part of Bosse family memorabilia.

Benjamin Bosse [1874-1922] was a remarkably creative and successful businessman who was Evansville's mayor from 1914 to 1922. He constantly searched out ways to improve Evansville. The Coliseum, F. J. Reitz and Bosse High Schools, Evansville College, and Bosse Baseball Field are just a few of the many projects he worked for that are still important parts of Evansville today. An active member of Trinity Lutheran Church, he served as the Cemetery's Secretary-Treasurer from 1895 until his death in 1922, personally caring for its landscaping.

Three other mayors of Evansville are buried in the Lutheran Cemetery—John W. Boehne [1906-1909], business partner and mentor; William H. Dress [1935-1943, 1948-1949], protegee; and Edwin F. Diekmann [1949-1952], family friend. The tour includes many other interesting and prominent citizens who were part of Evansville's growth.


11TH ANNUAL ELS GOLF SCRAMBLE

Christ's Life, Our Light Indiana District Convention Report

On June 23-24, your pastor and lay delegate, Jeff Sensmeier, attended the 23rd Convention of the Indiana District in Ft. Wayne. The Convention theme was *Christ's Life, Our Light*, based upon John 1:4, "In Him was life and the life was the light of men." In his report, District President Rev. Dr. Daniel Brege confessed, "Christ's identity and every aspect of Christ's life give us light. This light can be summarized as our confession; from His life we confess who Jesus is and what His life has done for us. As Christians, we are called upon to be faithful to our Lord Jesus Christ, and thus faithful to the light that flows from His life. This means that we must be faithful in our confession. As a synod, we walk together in our confession, in the light emanating from the life of Christ." President Brege chaired the entire convention but is retiring from office after serving one extended 4-year term.

The first day of the convention, the delegates elected a new president, Rev. Dr. D. Richard Stuckwisch, Jr. President elect Stuckwisch has served for 30 years in the ministry with experience as an adjunct professor at Concordia Theological Seminary and as a mission field professor in Asia and Russia. He has a Sacred Theology Masters in historic theology and a PhD in liturgics. He has served as circuit visitor and two terms as vice-president of the Indiana District northwest region. Dr. Stuckwisch will be leaving his parish in South Bend to begin serving as president in the fall. The delegates also elected the following vice-presidents.

Rev. Peter Brock – 1st V.P., northeast region, St. John-Bingen; Decatur, IN

Rev. David Mueller – 2nd V.P., central region, Trinity; Goodland, IN

Rev. Nathan Rastl – 3rd V.P., southern region, St. Peter; Vincennes, IN

Rev. Erich Fickel – 4th V.P., northwest region, St. Paul; Chesterton, IN

Rev. Rastl also serves in our Evansville west circuit and represents us to the District office. The convention also approved the elections of Rev. David Wiist as our circuit visitor for the Evansville west circuit and Rev. Nathan Rusert as circuit visitor for the Evansville east circuit. Beth Maxwell, wife of Rev. Ron Maxwell of St. John Vincennes, was elected to be District Treasurer, and Jim Claybourn of St. Paul Evansville was again elected to the Board of Directors.

During the two-day convention, the delegates passed the below resolutions presented by the floor committee on theology, education, and outreach.

- 1-01: To Support the Mission and Mercy Work in Tanzania
- 1-02: To Improve Communications between the District and Constituent State Governments
- 1-03: To Declare the Essential Nature of the Divine Service as the Physical Gathering of the Communion of Saints
- 1-04: To Reject the Practice of "Online or Virtual Communion"
- 1-05: To Develop Guidelines for Church Operation during an Epidemic
- 1-06: To Promote Classical Lutheran Pedagogy
- 1-07: To Love Our Neighbor by Rebuking False Doctrine
 - (i.e. resolved that the District President encourage education institutions to remain steadfast in confessing the authority of God in His Word, and not to use "commitment to diversity, equity, and inclusion" as a rule and standard to evaluate those serving in them)
- 1-08: To Encourage Indiana District Congregations to Start Ten New Congregations

The delegates also passed the below resolution presented by the floor committee on administration and structure.

- 2-02: Overture to Amend the Bylaws of the District to Become Effective at the 2025 Convention
 - (i.e. whereas the tasks given councils and committees of the District could be accomplished more efficiently, effectively, and economically, be it resolved to eliminate the Councils for Congregational Outreach, Services, and Resources, and the Committees on Ministerial Health and Worship and Spiritual Care)

The convention was addressed by Rev. Benjamin Ball, Synod Central Region V.P. and Synod President Rev. Dr. Matthew Harrison. In conjunction with resolution 1-07 above, they both addressed concerns with the secular views of critical race theory, diversity, equity, and inclusion infiltrating the Concordia University System in opposition to the Scriptural view of God's creation of male and female in His image and the salvation of all nations through Jesus Christ alone. As President of Concordia Theological Seminary in Ft. Wayne and in celebration of the synod's 175th anniversary, Rev. Dr. Laurence Rast gave a presentation on the beginnings of the LCMS and a favorable report on the expanding ministries of both seminaries. Dr. Rast will be with us to preach and present at our Heritage Sunday on September 18. The convention also heard reports from the LLL and Lutheran Hour Ministries and the LWML, which approved our request for a \$5,000 grant for our preschool at their last convention.

During the convention on Friday, Pastor Martin Keller announced as a point of information that the Supreme Court had overturned the Roe v. Wade decision and held that the Constitution does not confer a right to abortion. As a response of praise and thanksgiving to God, all the delegates rose and sang the doxology. The convention ended with a closing service at St. Paul Ft. Wayne where synod president Matthew Harrison preached on the Propers for the Nativity of John the Baptist, a very happy convergence with the Supreme Court ruling.
