## Partners in the Work



When I write thank you notes to those who support us and the work in Taiwan, I often mention how foreign mission work is very much a team effort, and we need many partners to support us. Certainly you are one of those partners, for which we are very grateful. There are also many other partners in the work we do, some of

which I'd like to briefly introduce here. First are other Lutheran Church bodies, including especially the LCMS partner synod here, the China Evangelical Lutheran Church (CELC). We are only here because the CELC has invited us to be partners with them in their own work. Aside from the CELC, we especially partner with others in the area of resource development. The Lutheran Church – Hong Kong Synod (the LCMS' partner synod in Hong Kong) and the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod's mission team in Hong Kong are great partners in this regard. Finally are two Recognized Service Organizations of the LCMS, the Lutheran Heritage Foundation (LHF), and the Evangelical Lutheran Mission Society for the Chinese (ELMSC). I have worked very closely with LHF for 20 years now, helping to coordinate their Chinese publications. Their most recent publication, a new Chinese translation of the Book of Concord, is a huge blessing to the Chinese Church worldwide, and another Chinese translation, Lutheranism 101, is very near publication. ELMSC is a newer organization, which focuses on Lutheran Chinese theological education and resource development. Their annual Mandarin Chinese seminar at Concordia Theological Seminary, Ft. Wayne, Indiana, and their outstanding website full of Lutheran Chinese resources (www.lutheranchinese.org), are two examples of their contributions.

I thank my God in all my remembrance of you, always in every prayer of mine for you all making my prayer with joy, because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now. And I am sure of this, that he who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ. (Philippians 1:3-6 ESV)

### Chinese Seminar in Ft. Wayne

ELMSC (introduced on the first page of this newsletter) held its 7<sup>th</sup> Annual *Chinese*Seminar on Holy Scripture and Luther's Small Catechism June 17-20 on the campus of Concordia Theological Seminary (CTS), Ft. Wayne, IN. I was one of the speakers,



presenting primarily on the Lord's Supper, as taught in the *Small Catechism*. I also translated for CTS professor Rev. John Pless, who also spoke on the Lord's Supper. This year a record 13 adults and 7 children (not including speakers and their families) attended. Our daughter Elizabeth helped considerably as well, leading a children's program and accompanying on piano for daily Matins and Compline. While my service at this seminar in the US is obviously not *missionary service in Taiwan*, it is certainly related, as I can use what I taught there here in Taiwan, and our Taiwan mission team hopes that our work here, particularly that involving theological education, can more and more be shared with the Chinese Church worldwide.
