## **COVID-19 Update**

The good news is that the Taiwan government continues to very slowly relax restrictions within Taiwan and open the borders to those coming in from the outside. We're especially thankful that now Christian missionaries are final able to apply for visas to come here. We



are first anticipating Rev. Dr. Tom Park's arrival, who has been waiting for well over a year to get in. After him, several others will Lord-willing be arriving in the next several months. The bad news is that everyone is still required to wear masks here nearly all the time, short-term visitors to Taiwan are still not allowed in, and quarantine requirements make life difficult for many. Several of our members have contracted the coronavirus, and one member's father died partly as a result. We continue to pray for our Lord's mercy and strength, and also for relief from this plague.



# **Update on Ryan & Candace**

I've written previously about Ryan Chou, the younger son of our now *Vicar* Dingtai Chou, and his girlfriend Candace. I first led a study on worldviews with them, and then led them through many Old Testament Bible stories. Lately, though, I taught a Church membership class for Ryan, and Candace was willing to join our

discussions. This past Sunday, Ryan became a communicant member of our congregation (and his father promptly put him to work, helping prepare for our upcoming VBS!). Candace has yet to confess faith in Christ, but she continues to meet with Ryan and me, and has been coming very regularly to Sunday worship with Ryan as well. They are planning to get married probably sometime in the next year. We all hope and pray that God's Word and Spirit will first grant her Christian faith and lead her to desire Christian baptism.
