

GIFTS OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

In the last two newsletter articles we talked about the Holy Spirit, his person and his work. Today we want to review some of His spiritual gifts. For Christmas and birthdays we often give gifts to our children. These gifts often come wrapped in beautiful packages decorated with colored wrapping paper. God the Holy Spirit also gives gifts to us, his children. He gives us these gifts at our baptism and during His Divine Service. These gifts come to us in the beautiful packages of His Word and Sacraments. But just what are some of these gifts of the Holy Spirit?

Through His Word and Sacraments, the Holy Spirit freely gives to all Christians the gifts of faith in Christ, the forgiveness of sins, and eternal life. When you were baptized or when you first heard the Word of the Gospel, the Holy Spirit was there handing you the package of faith in Christ. Your belief in Jesus your Savior, whether as infant or an adult, is a gift of the Holy Spirit. Through this faith in Christ, the Holy Spirit also gives you hands to receive His next gift, the forgiveness of sins. Through faith in Christ, you receive the gift of forgiveness of sins when you hear Christ's word of absolution and when you receive His body and blood in the bread and wine of Holy Communion. And because your sins are forgiven, the Holy Spirit hands you the next gift of eternal life. As Luther says in our catechism, "For where there is forgiveness of sins, there is also life and salvation." The Holy Spirit gives all these gifts of faith, forgiveness, and life to all Christians through the packages of His Word and Sacraments.

But besides these gifts which the Holy Spirit gives to all Christians, there are also special gifts of the Holy Spirit which He gives to some Christians at certain times and places. In the days of the prophets and during apostolic times, the Holy Spirit also gave some Christians the gift to perform miraculous signs and wonders, for example, healings, speaking in tongues, and raising the dead. These are gifts, however, which always accompanied the preaching of the Word of God. They gave God's testimony or stamp of approval that the prophet or apostle was speaking the truth of God's Word. The Holy Spirit sometimes gave prophets in the Old Testament and apostles in the New Testament the gifts to heal others, to prophecy in other languages, and even to raise the dead. These gifts marked them as one sent from God to speak His Word. "The things that mark an apostle - signs, wonders, and miracles - were done among you with great perseverance." (2 Corinthians 12:12) But God gives the warning that we should not follow after a prophet who does miraculous signs but who does not preach the true Word of God. "If a prophet . . . gives you a sign or a wonder, and the sign or wonder that he tells you comes to pass, and if he says, 'Let us go after other gods' . . . you shall not listen to the words of that prophet . . . for the Lord your God is testing you." (Deuteronomy 13:1-3) It is easy for a person to get caught up in the excitement of the miracle and disregard the preaching of the one who performed it. The miracle always accompanies and supports the true preaching of the Word of God.

We must remember, however, that the Scriptures do not teach that God will necessarily give all Christians in every time and place special miraculous gifts. The Holy Spirit bestows His blessings according to His good pleasure. Today there are many Pentecostal or Charismatic churches (charisma means "gift") which only focus on these special gifts of the Holy Spirit, these miracle of healing and speaking in tongues, and not God's salvation in Jesus Christ. However these healings have often been staged and later discovered to be false. Speaking in tongues in the Bible always meant speaking a human language, but this new speaking in tongues, only popular in the last century, is only gibberish. Some people claim to have the gift to interpret this gibberish, but there are as many interpretations as there are interpreters. Some people later confess that they simply faked speaking in tongues because of the peer pressure from their church to do so. There are reports of the Holy Spirit giving some missionaries the gifts of healing and signs in order to crack a pagan culture and give credibility to their preaching of the Gospel. God can indeed work supernatural miracles when and where he chooses. However, we find that these signs and wonders in the church ceased with the time of the prophets and apostles when God was recording his written Word through them. If you ever run into a preacher who claims that he has these special gifts of healing and tongues, ask him if he has raised anyone from the dead lately, because that's what the prophets and apostles also did through the Holy Spirit.

Besides special supernatural gifts, the apostle Paul also speaks about special natural gifts which God gives to individual Christians. "Having gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let us use them; if prophecy, in proportion to our faith; if service, in our serving; the one who teaches, in his teaching; the one who exhorts, in his exhortation; the one who contributes, in generosity; the one who leads, with zeal; the one who does acts of mercy, with cheerfulness." (Romans 12:6-8) Besides faith, forgiveness, and life, the Holy Spirit has also given you natural talents and abilities to use in serving his church and serving your neighbor in your daily vocation. Let us also use them.
