

Greetings in the name of Christ! This first newsletter of combining months is going to be a little odd. In this article I need to succinctly talk about the seasons of Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany. Those of you who have been in my 19-minute Bible studies know how well I can do this.

This Advent and Christmas we are using a series from 1517 called "Coming Home for Christmas: Advent in Isaiah." The series focuses on five passages in Isaiah where the promises of God, fulfilled in either Jesus 'arrival or his second coming, proclaim to us that while we long to find peace, belonging, and comfort this time of year, our ultimate Christmas gift is our citizenship in his kingdom. For he is the Home who has come to win us back from exile, keep us safe in his embrace, and promises that we will someday reside with him forever.

Our Advent services will be December 3rd and 10th at 7:00 PM and the 17th at 7:30 PM. Christmas Eve service of lessons and carols will be on the 24th at 7:00 PM with a Christmas Day Divine Service at 9:00 AM.

Coming into the new calendar year and the Epiphany season, we will have our Epiphany celebration on Tuesday, January 6th at 7:00 PM Along with Epiphany and the coming of the Magi, I will once again be offering the rite of house blessing with a chalking of the door. The Blessing for a Home is a celebration of vocation in the deepest and broadest sense. We bless and thank God for the gift of "clothing and shoes, food and drink, house and home, wife and children, land, animals, and all I have" while engaging and honoring the ways people practice their faith in their life at home: chores and hobbies, cooking and eating, ways of relaxing, relationships within the household and beyond it, caring for our bodies, connecting with the creation.

Our homes are also the place where many of us will make the greatest strides in our spiritual growth, through observance of daily prayer, daily spending time in God's Word, and work offered as an oblation to God.

The chalking of the doors of a home encourages Christians to dedicate their life at home to God and to others. Seeing the symbols over our doors can help to remind us, while passing in and out on our daily routines, that our homes and all those who dwell there belong to Christ. It also serves as a reminder of the welcome that the Magi gave to Jesus. We should strive to be as welcoming to all who come to our homes to visit us!

In these three seasons, Advent's longing, Christmas's joy, and Epiphany's revealing, we are reminded that God continually draws us home. Christ comes to us in the manger, dwells with us in Word and Sacrament, and sanctifies the ordinary spaces where we eat, sleep, labor, and love. As we mark our doors and bless our houses, we remember that our true Home is not finally built by human hands, but given to us in Jesus through our baptism. He gathers us from exile, shelters us in his mercy, and will one day bring us into the everlasting household of his Father. Until that day, our earthly homes become small signs and foretastes of the greater Home he has prepared for us.
